It was Christmas Eve night 1982 at St. Peter's U.C.C., in Clinton, Ohio. The weather was unseasonably warm. People were outdoors in their shirt sleeves visiting, while the sanctuary was filling up with the smiling faces of worshippers.

We had planned to be in the sanctuary for the late service. Then an email was received from the Heartland Conference, STRONGLY recommending that there be <u>no indoor worship</u> through the end of the calendar year. The COVID virus has spread in some of our congregations and deaths can be directly attributed to it.

Thank you for your patience through these changing circumstances. Please know that you have brothers and sisters in Christ who care about you, and are acting in prayerful consideration for the greater good of all.

Even though social distancing is keeping us apart, there is "nothing that can separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus, our Lord (Romans 8:39)."

And after we light our electric candles and sing *Silent Night*, the hope, peace, and love of the Advent/Christmas season will be carried out into the world with this song in our hearts.


