



Dear members and friends of St. John's,

"All the brothers and sisters send greetings. Greet one another with a holy kiss." (1 Corinthians 16:20)

My first preaching assignment as a student at Ashland Theological Seminary, was at the Perrysville Presbyterian Church. The dozen or so worshippers liked my sermon so much that they welcomed me back several more times.

As exciting as it was to preach, I was almost as excited to greet people after the service. I'll never forget how it felt to walk down the center aisle, put on my best preacher's smile and start shaking hands.

Since that Sunday morning, I've preached and shook hands at many churches – 40 years' worth to be exact. As the song says, "I've been everywhere, man!" And it's never gotten old. After 15 months of covid restrictions, it feels all fresh and new to be shaking your hands again in the sanctuary of St. John's UCC.

It's like we're having a rebirth right into this age of hybrid worship. What a blessing it was (and is) to have our drive-in services, even if it meant welcoming you through open car windows, or waving at you from the front steps after the benedictions. And we'll continue to share hospitality in-person and virtually, by worshipping indoors and outdoors and live-streaming.

If I ever took these "How do you do?" moments for granted, I never will again. I stand ready – pun intended, to shake your hands, bump fists, touch elbows or simply exchange smiles. It's all a part of what Paul refers to as a "holy kiss" an ancient practice of affection and friendship much like the modern handshake.

As your pastor and fellow traveler on our faith journeys, I want you to always feel welcome and appreciated for the persons you are, and the gifts you bring. And whether it's for a season, or many seasons in your lives, I want you to know that St. John's is a sacred space, where you can feel safe and secure in the loving arms of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

The Church Council of St. John's met on Monday, June 21.

Treasurer's Report: Frank Davis

We are \$8105 ahead in Faith Promise giving, and \$5.76 below budget in expenses.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Mark Katrick

We will continue to use caution regarding hand-shaking, etc.

Old Business: Parking Lot Redo: Frank Davis

4 bids have been received from asphalt companies for:

Redoing the 3 concrete catch basins

Milling the lots and putting down 3 inches of asphalt (both parking lots, the alley to Prospect Street, the Parsonage driveway) (including grinding down the old stuff for patching)

Replacing the parking blocks

Restriping

The Stewardship and Finance Committee has set aside \$115,000 for the parking lot from the Reserve Fund, subject to Congregational approval.

Tables will be set up again in Hermann Hall.




The next meeting of Church Council will be Monday, July 19, at 6:30 p.m. in the Meeting Room. All members of St. John's are always welcome to attend.

Cradle Roll childcare will be available starting July 11 during the 11AM Indoor service.


Rally day is September 12. Join us following the 11AM service for a church picnic to kick off the new church year.
