We have been interviewing candidates and hope to have a person in place soon. The Interim position is important as this person bridges the time after a Settled Pastor leaves, in our case Mark is retiring, and we call a Settled Pastor as his replacement. After we have the Interim Minister in place, we will be communicating and seeking your input on the many items that are included in our Church Profile. The process of developing a profile, posting the permanent Pastoral position and finding that person is typically 2 years. We will continue to keep you updated as we proceed through this journey. Dear members and friends of St. John's,

One of the things you've learned about me these past 13 years is that I don't have very good teeth. But I do have a very good dentist, Dr. Tyler Anderson.

Along with his brother, Dr. Zachary, and Dr. Brian Stickel, they have gotten me through some difficult and even life-threatening situations (like the infection that led to my needing time off that led to your kindly and generously giving me a sabbatical).

The latest chapter in this ongoing story, is the root canal I had a couple of weeks ago. It ended up being a nearly three-hour procedure. As usual, I didn't feel a thing (not even the shot of Novocain going in). The only discomfort I had was the pain in my neck for not being able to move it. They even did something about that, by moving the chair around in different positions.

So what does a person do to pass the time, when he has half a hardware store being used to work on his mouth or being installed in it? In this particular instance, I did what I do in spiritual direction (either giving or receiving it). I sat and listened to what the Holy One was saying to me. And when I wasn't doing that, I listened to an ongoing conversation between Dr. Tyler and the skilled technician that was working with him.

What I found myself in the middle of was an awesome and amazing lecture on dentistry. It was simply incredible the amount of information that was being exchanged between them. And it opened my eyes to the full scope (pun intended) of all the dental work I've had done by all my dentists and their technicians throughout the years.

As a pastor, I've stored up 40 years-worth of all kinds of useful dental and medical knowledge. It has greatly helped me to better understand and relate to what members of my church are going through, physically, emotionally and spiritually.

Jesus, the Divine-human One has experienced these kinds of discomfort and pain to depths we cannot even begin to imagine. And he did it, not only to better relate to us as Lord and Savior, but to save us from our sins with his sacrificial love.

Which answers one of the many questions I was pondering during that three-hour marathon. Where's Jesus? Well, he's where he always is. In the third chair.

It was the same chair where my father sat, when I was afraid to have my first filling, and where I sat when my three children were experiencing the same.

So the next time you are on an extended visit to have work done on your teeth, take a deep breath, and block out the noise and distractions (like the whirring of a dentist's drill). Then listen for any conversations that may be going on around you. It will enlighten and help you to empathize with what others are going through at that same moment in time.

Say a prayer for them, and yourselves too. Then, look over to the third chair and give all your feelings and experiences over to Jesus, listen for his still, small voice and let him carry the load.

Like my wonderful dentist, and the one who was assisting him, he will take care of you. And you will feel no pain, only "peace that surpasses all understanding." (Philippians 4:7)

So that is my story. Every bit of it is true, because I always tell the truth. And I'm doing my best to teach Chucky to do the same.


