They typically stay for 2 years or until our search for a settled Pastor is complete. We have completed the description, presented to Church Council and has been approved by Council. We will submit this to the CSEOA UCC's Administrative Pastor Melodie Rezac and she will review and post soon.

Dear members and friends of St. John's,

Besides the Fellowship Room, what would you say the most popular gathering place is at St. John's, before and after our worship services? I would say it is the hallway in the office annex.

It is here you will find rows of confirmation class pictures going all the way back to 1915 and continuing on through 2020.

To those of you who are not familiar with confirmation in the United Church of Christ, here is a brief description of the rite and the reasons for it.

A person is brought into the universal church, the body of Christ, through the sacrament of baptism. When an infant or very young child is baptized, the baptismal promises are made by parents and sponsors.

These adults assume certain responsibilities for the Christian nurture of the baptized child, along with the entire congregation, so that he or she may grow in awareness and understanding of the meaning of life in Christ.

As a child approaches adolescence, the local church offers that person the opportunity to give public assent to the baptismal promises. Confirmation celebrates this occasion of affirmation in the life of the individual and of the local church.

On Sunday, June 5, Emmaleigh Crowthers will be baptized, confirmed and receive her first communion as a voting member of the church. Then she'll have her picture taken by Pamela Tulloss, a member of the Christian Education Committee, to be framed and mounted with all of the others.

After you've had some cake and punch in the Fellowship Room, served up by Tim and Beth Powers on behalf of the Special Events Committee, why not spend some time in the hallway in the office annex. You students of culture and history will enjoy the hairstyles, clothing and robes worn by the boys and girls and their pastors.

You'll find that one of these boys, Alan Crowthers, and other members of his class are wearing handmade stoles. And Emma will be wearing her uncle Alan's stole on her confirmation day.

Your leisurely stroll will help you remember and share stories about the day you affirmed or reaffirmed your Christian faith, whenever, wherever and however they occurred.

Most importantly, it will give you another opportunity to renew your baptismal promises, by saying these words from the order for confirmation in the UCC Book of Worship.

O God, my God, known to me in Jesus Christ, I give myself to you as your own, to love and serve you faithfully all the days of my life. Amen.

The work continues! S.A.R.A. deeply appreciates your generous donations and will continue to accept funds to help support the folks in Ukraine.






