Dr. Stephen Lowell Swisher is the new Pastor of St. John's United Church of Christ, returns home to Licking County. He previously served for 5 years in Etna, Ohio and comes back to us from serving as the Senior Pastor of Fountain Fellowship Church in Columbus. Previously in Licking County, Dr. Swisher was a Coach for Special Olympics, a Coach and Referee for Upward Basketball, and worked closely with Judge David Branstool and others to help rehabilitate and support youth in the at risk community. He also became a leading voice for hope and encouragement for all people throughout the region.

Dr. Swisher has also served as a Regional Hospice Chaplain with responsibility for more than 250 patients throughout Michigan and Ohio.

Swisher's ministry has a hallmark of significant community involvement. He was elected President, Vice-President and Chaplain for Rotary and voted by his peers President of the Monahans Chamber of Commerce, where he led unprecedented economic growth including a new Hospital partnership with the U.S. Government and the construction of a new grocery store. During his tenure, Swisher appointed the first African American and Hispanic American members of the Chamber's Executive Committee in the history of the Community.

He is the author of "God's Way to Good Health" published by the Martin Luther King, Jr. Press in New York and has been published in numerous Christian periodicals. He also has been a frequent contributor to television, radio and print media in the areas of Religion and Practical Theology. He hosted his own Television program entitled "Positive Living" for more than a decade.

In his free time he enjoys reading historical novels, watching vintage films, swimming and kayaking Ohio's Lakes and serving as a Coach and Referee for Special Olympics and Upward Basketball.

Dr. Swisher is the son of Dr. Lowell and Barbara Swisher and the father of Ms. Emily Swisher. He resides in Newark, Ohio.
