Church Council Notes for Monday, September 16, 2024



*Council* Church Council met Monday, September 16, 2024, with members Jeff Connor, April Kinser, Gary Kinser, Greg Crowthers, Frances Hill, Brian Lensink, Mike Dooley, and Tim Powers present as well as Office Assistant Kim Workman.

President Jeff Connor provided the devotional meditation for the evening. His message was based on the book, "Against the Grain" by football coach, author, and podcaster Bill Courtney. Mr Courtney is a highly successful football coach and motivator who believes in the power of everyday people to promote change in the lives of others. "We all have something to give", and encourages others to stretch themselves and step outside their comfort zone if necessary to find ways that are right for them to provide assistance to others.

Renovations to the parsonage are almost complete with move in day scheduled for 10/2/2024.

Council approved requests for the church use of the Fellowship room in November for continued study of "The Chosen" series and for a German speaking service on December 8, 2024, in the sanctuary which will be in conjunction with the Newark Maennerchor to provide German speakers.

A media guideline policy was introduced and accepted.

An estimate has been received for flat roof area repair (no slate) and the repair was approved, not to exceed \$7000.00. This will include emergency and preventative work.

Rev Walker recommended in her report we consider doing a parsonage blessing as we start this new phase as a congregation.

# Why Are You So Afraid?

# Matthew 8:26 He got up and rebuked the winds and the waves, and it was completely calm.

This past year I was privileged to be on a wonderful mission trip to the small town of Mahdia in Guyana. I became a little fearful one day, though, when I saw a tarantula hanging on the wall of an outhouse. I was




incredibly thankful for a pastor who knew how to bring calm into that scary situation for me. He did it with a gracious smile on his face and a broom in his hand—and I still wonder what he was really thinking of this Canadian at that moment.

Jesus' disciples had been with him long enough to have watched him step in, heal the sick, provide food, and do other miracles. And yet there in a boat, in the midst of "a furious storm," fear showed up again. This storm was probably bigger than most of the storms these fishermen had seen over the years—and the moment of panic set in. I sometimes wonder if they had forgotten who was in the boat with them, or if maybe they were just annoyed that he was sleeping.

Nevertheless, Jesus' question applies to us today just as it did to his first followers: If you know me, "why are you afraid?" In what difficulties do you hear him say, "Trust me in whatever you are facing, and see what I can do"?

God, forgive us when we walk in fear instead of faith. Thank you for being bigger than our fear. Help us to remember that even in the midst of the biggest storms, you, the Lord of all, are able to bring calm. Amen.
