

Take what you need. Give what you can.



Back to School Time

As summer rolls on, we are reminded that school will be starting soon. Our mission focus this month will be the Look Up Center, a community-education and service center with the Glory Rising school for children ages 3 to 5 years. This is a faith-based, half-day learning program for potty-trained children which includes art and music and preparation for school readiness. They are dependent on local support for their Christ-centered outreach. We can assist with necessary supplies. Donations needed include: Glue sticks, Crayons, Markers, colored pencils, tissues, hand wipes (Not bottles of sanitizer) and paper towels. Snacks needed include individual bags (Small) of cookies, chips or goldfish, juice boxes, animal crackers, fruit roll ups, fruit cups, applesauce, and pudding (individual servings). Donations may be dropped off in the Fellowship Room and will be delivered prior to the start of school in September.
