Purple Strips of Cloth



Be sure to pick up a purple strip of cloth at the front or rear of the sanctuary. Purple is the color of Lent. It symbolizes pain, suffering, mourning and penitence. It signifies the feeling of sorrow for our sins in the light of Christ's passion

and death. In Lent, purple is used beginning Ash Wednesday and extending through Maundy Thursday.

Use the strip of cloth in a way so that you see it every day as a reminder of Lent and in preparation of Easter. For example, tie it on your rearview mirror, tie it on your purse, on a kitchen cabinet or lay it across your workspace.



Like any other relationship, our relationship with God benefits from daily connection. And it makes sense that reading the Bible is a great place to start. Guidance for life: Many devotionals provide practical insights and guidance on how to apply biblical principles to everyday situations, helping you navigate life's challenges through the lens of your faith. **Cultivation of spiritual discipline**: Establishing a habit of daily devotions can promote discipline and consistency in your spiritual life.

Community and fellowship: Many devotionals are designed for individual use, but they can also serve as a point of connection with others who share your faith (or those who may not). Discussing what you've learned in your devotional time with others can deepen your relationships and strengthen your faith.

As you begin your devotional journey, reflect on the benefits of reading God's Word as described in 2 Timothy:

All scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right. God uses it to prepare and equip his people to do every good work. @ Timothy 3:16-17, NLT.


